We're Able to Engage – and it's All Because of YOU!

If there's an adjective to describe 2017 for CREA, it certainly has to be "engaging".

At the end of October, we hosted the fourth and final of our roundtable programme for 2017, this time on the theme of work & employment. Guests came from right across the island, including representatives from almost every single government ministry: Finance, Health, Home Affairs, Manpower, National Development, Trade & Industry and Social & Family Development.

Dr Seonghoon Kim presented some recent results from the SLP labour module, which showed that one third of respondents have quit a job because they were dissatisfied: most commonly due to low pay, relations with their colleagues, or having to work too many hours. He also found that 2% of respondents are working in the gig economy, for example, for Grab or Uber.

Also speaking were our international collaborators from RAND Corporation in the United States. Professor

Michael D. Hurd found that our respondents are a highly dynamic workforce: one third of respondents started their current job within the last five years, and upon becoming unemployed, half found a new job within one month.


Finally, Professor Susann Rohwedder looked at the expectations of respondents in their late 50s and found that just under half of men and a third of women expect that they will still be working when they are 65. The media were very interested in this result, with articles by Bloomberg, Channel NewsAsia, Lianhe Zaobao, Lianhe Wanbao, Shin Min Daily News, The Straits Times, Today Online and even The Star from Malaysia.

When did respondents start their current job?



In September, we asked employed respondents when they started their current job. One in three has changed job within the past five years – a highly dynamic workforce. But many have also been in their job for a long time, 15 years on average. Fifty said that they started their current job before 1970!
